<b>Removal Goods</b>	<p><u>From the Origin Agent:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Copy of AWB (for airfreights)</li> <li>- Original OBL (for sea freights)</li> <li>- Descriptive Inventory / Packing List</li> <li>- Itemized Valued Inventory</li> <li>- Certificate of insurance (if applicable).</li> </ul> <p><u>To the consignee at destination:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Authorization Letter/s attested by the Saudi Chamber of Commerce (formats to be provided to the consignee upon arrival at destination). For government hired employees, only the seal of the agency is required.</li> <li>- Copy of consignee's passport with the entry visa page</li> <li>- Copies of Residence Permit (Iqama) or Saudi National's ID (Bataqa)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Valued over SR 10,000.00 (about US\$ 3,000.00), all articles, new &amp; used, are subject to customs duty payment assessed on their CIF value.</li> <li>- Electrical Appliances – 5 %</li> <li>- Audio / Video CD's - 5%</li> <li>- Furniture - 15%</li> <li>- All similar items manufactured in Saudi Arabia are subject to customs duties at 5-15 %</li> <li>- Books and used clothing at reasonable quantities are exempted from duty payment</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- If receipts / invoices are not available, all items will be assessed by the Customs Authority based on local value.</li> <li>- All containerized shipments must be on pallets or in lift vans failure of which the Seaport Authority will impose penalty for bad stowage (loose loaded).</li> <li>- Consignee or the owner of the shipment must be in Saudi Arabia at the time of customs clearance, otherwise, shipment will not be cleared.</li> </ul>
<b>Electrical / Electronic Appliances</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Purchase Receipts / Invoice</li> <li>- Descriptive Inventory for air shipments must be attached to the Airway Bill.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Subject to customs duty - (5 % of CIF Value)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- In the absence of purchase receipts, the Customs Authority will assess the goods based on local value.</li> </ul>
<b>Prohibited Goods:</b>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Subject to automatic confiscation</li> </ul> <p><u>NOTE:</u> All incoming shipments to Saudi Arabia are subject to rigorous full physical inspection (100%).</p>	<p><b>IMPORTANT:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Items marked with asterisk (*) can be re-exported at shipper/consignee's expense.</li> <li>- Bringing these items without declaration, especially wines and/or any alcoholic beverages, will be considered as an smuggling attempt,</li> </ul>

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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Military uniforms or military equipment of any kind. *</li> <li>• Alcoholic beverages, any food products containing alcohol such as Vanilla, flavoring extract, cooking wines, etc.</li> <li>• Books, wine making kits, or any other items used in the preparation or manufacture of alcoholic drinks and beverages.</li> <li>• Any kind of narcotics and/or unidentified medicines.</li> <li>• Any type of radio transmitter or communications equipment (including receivers, VHF, Marine, police bands or walkie talkies). *</li> <li>• Stuffed Animals, statues, figurines, carving or objects depicting human or animal form *</li> <li>• Pornographic materials and literatures to include fashion magazines with people wearing underwear or swimsuits.</li> <li>• Any foodstuffs containing alcohol, pork and related pork meat products, etc.</li> <li>• Any books pertaining to religion other than Islam.</li> </ul>			<p>hence, heavy penalty will be imposed. Aside from confiscation of the item, a penalty of US\$ 200.00 for a bottle of wine. For large quantity, the shipper/consignee will be brought to court and may be imprisoned.</p>
<p><b><u>Goods Subject to Censorship</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Exposed film, including prints, slides, etc.</li> <li>• Records, books, magazines, pictures/photos, &amp; other printed matters.</li> <li>• Personal computers, audio/video CD's, diskettes, USB's, computer hard disks, printers.</li> <li>• Mobile or Cellular phones</li> <li>• Audio/video VHS/VCR/cassette tapes, phonograph recordings.</li> </ul>		<p>- A penalty will be charged to the consignee for CD's, VCR tapes and books confiscated after the censorship. (US\$ 135.00 each for CD's &amp; VCR tapes, and US\$ 14.00 each for books).</p>	<p>- If such items are in a PE &amp; HHG shipment, Customs Authority will remove them from the container for censorship or review.</p> <p>- To reduce the time for clearance, these items must be packed separately for easy access and carton/s must be marked clearly and on the inventory; or you may send them off by</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Motors / Cars</li> </ul>	<p>New and used cars:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Title Certificate / Car Registrations</li> <li>Saudi Arabian Standard Organization (SASO) Conformity Certificate from the country of origin</li> <li>Police Clearance / de-registrations from the country of origin</li> <li>Other proofs of ownership i.e. Purchase Invoice</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Customs duty for cars is 5 % based on customs final assessed value.</li> <li>Right hand drive cars are not Accepted.</li> <li>Expatriates are only allowed to bring-in one car.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Any personal belongings are not allowed inside the Car.</li> <li>SASO Conformity Certificate may be secured in Saudi Arabia locally. SASO office may require replacement or conversion to some parts of the car to meet the SASO Standard at owner / consignee's expense. Application for the SASO Conformity Certificate may be rejected and may be required to re-export the car back to origin at owner's expense.</li> </ul>
